Turks Close ICA Office At Istanbul

All Colonization Work Is Halted; Official Denial Of Raid Refuted

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, June 20—The premises of the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA) in Istanbul have been closed down by the Turkish authorities and the activities of the organization have been stopped, according to a report today in Davar, Palestine Hebrew daily, from reliable sources in Turkey.

This report is in direct contradiction to an official communique issued by the Turkish authorities that the raid had taken place on the association's headquarters in Istanbul. The communique was sent out by the Turkish Telegraphic Agency from Anatolia.

Avoid Palestine Advice Jewish leaders in Palestine are greatly interested in the fate of the Jewish Colonization Association office in Turkey, since the raid was made on the charge that the Association was allegedly encouraging Jewish emigration from Turkey into Palestine. Zionist activities in Turkey are prohibited. The Jewish Colonization Association, therefore, in giving emigration advice to Jews, carefully avoided advice concerning Palestine.

The offices of the Jewish Colonization Association in Istanbul have been functioning in Turkey since many years before the World War as a branch of the central headquarters of the Association which are located in Paris.

Stop Sale Here Of Nazi Paper

Shipments of Stuermer Confiscated by U. S. Customs Men

The Stuermer, lurid Nazi publication of which Julius Streicher, anti-Semite No. 1, is the publisher, will no longer be distributed in New York, it became known yesterday as a result of measure taken by the United States Customs authorities.

Seizure of shipments of the Stuermer on German steamers by customs inspectors here has made it clear to the Nazi authorities in Germany that the United States frowns upon the publication. Sending of the Stuermer through American mails will also be suspended, it was learned yesterday.

The DAWA, a Nazi organization in America whose aim is to foster the boycott of Jewish firms here, was liquidated this week. It is understood that a new organization of a similar nature is being established under the name Deutscher Konsum-Verband.

Arms Mogul Defies Iron Guard, Weds Rumanian Girl Secretly

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, June 20—The secret marriage of Max Ausschmitt, a Jewish industrialist, and Livia Porden, daughter of the vice-president of the Rumanian Senate, has been reported here from Thilissara, a Rumanian town. The report has created a sensation. The couple's marriage was performed in secret because of threats of the anti-Semitic Iron Guard organization that it would not permit a Jew to marry a Rumanian girl. The ceremony took place in the private chapel of the Rumanian Catholic Bishop Dr. Pasha in Thilissara. The wedding is considered an

important event in the life of Rumanian society. Two Cabinet Ministers appeared at the ceremony as witnesses. Mr. Ausschmitt is the greatest power in Rumania's armament, mining and metal industries. He is a widower of forty-six, with a boy of ten. Miss Porden, who is one of the richest girls in the country, is twenty-two years old. (He is not to be confused with another Max Ausschmitt, also an industrialist of note, who is a member of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.)

Huleh Building Operations Set For Next Week

Drainage of Palestine Swamp Will Begin In Few Months

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, June 20—The Palestine Land Development Company, which obtained the concession over the Huleh territory on the Palestine-Syria frontier, announced today that it is starting construction of the first buildings in Huleh next week.

This will be the first time in the history of Palestine that life will be brought into the Huleh district. This swampy district has practically no inhabitants, with the exception of a few Arab families.

Elaborate plans are being prepared by the Palestine Land Development Company in collaboration with the Jewish Farmers Association, to start drainage of the swamps in Huleh on a large scale within the next few months. When the land has been drained, it will be settled by Jews. It is estimated that 8,000 Jewish families can be colonized there once the drainage operation is completed.

According to the projects of the Palestine Land Development Company and the Jewish Farmers Association, the settling of Jews in Huleh will be accomplished in three shifts. The first shift will be settled while the drainage work is still in process.

The Huleh concession has been for many years in the hands of Arabs. The Palestine government last year approved its sale to the Jews, since the Arab concessionaires had done nothing to develop the district.

Wino Protests Order Dissolving Community

The leaders of the Jewish Community announced today that they will send a petition to the higher authorities in Warsaw asking that the local order be voided.

Refuses to Go To Berlin On Good Will Tour

Major Cohen Withdraws From British Legion Delegation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, June 20—Major Brunel Cohen, treasurer of the British Legion, who was selected to go to Berlin as a member of the good-will party of British war veterans, announced today that he will not join the delegation.

In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Major Cohen, who lost both legs in the World War, explained that he has withdrawn from the delegation for the following reasons:

- (1) He believes that his visit to Germany would be against the wish of the British Jews.
- (2) He feels German Jews might resent the fact that a Jew from abroad is being entertained by the Nazi government.
- (3) He is afraid that the German government may interpret his visit as an indication that the British Jews are favorably inclined towards the Hitler regime.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, June 20—While the British government has strengthened the position of the Nazis by entering into a naval agreement with Hitler, British public opinion should protest against the continued anti-Jewish events in Germany, an editorial today in the Manchester Guardian demands.

May Ask Britain to Intervene In Deportation of Danzig Editor

Hasn't Changed Faith, Prof. Bergson States

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, June 20—Henri Bergson, 75-year-old internationally known philosopher, issued a statement today to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, denying categorically that he has embraced Catholicism.

The denial was issued in view of a report in the Nazi press stating that Bergson had given up his Jewish religion. Prof. Bergson, who is a member of the French Academy of Science, is still teaching in the College de Franco, despite his advanced age.

Reich Jews Told Not to Rely On Foreign Help

Advice Is Given by Max Warburg in Talk At Berlin

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, June 20—The Jews in Germany were warned today not to depend too much on help from abroad. The warning was given by Max Warburg, German Jewish leader, addressing the annual meeting of the Hilfsverein, the German-Jewish relief organization which is helping Jews to migrate from Germany.

"The Jews of Germany must understand that there is no such thing as a Jewish financial or economic world organization," Mr. Warburg said. "The Jews from abroad are merely aiding Jewish migration from Germany as part of their charity activities."

Mr. Warburg emphasized that the Hilfsverein is ready to cooperate with the Zionists for the creation of a spiritual and economic basis for Jewish emigrants from Germany. The fate of German Jewry, he said, cannot be solved by the Hilfsverein, which is only an institution assisting prospective emigrants against making false steps.

Soviet Allows Jews To Hold 100 Acres For Own Use

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) MOSCOW, June 20—The possession of land as private property was permitted by the Soviet government today for Jews in Biro-Bidjan, the Jewish autonomous district in the Far East.

The decision to permit Jewish settlers in Biro-Bidjan to own land as private property came as a result of a recommendation submitted by the Soviet authorities in the Far East, with the approval of the Communist Party there.

This startling decision, which is a deviation from fundamental Communist principles, is explained by the fact that "the peculiar qualities and conditions of the Far East must be taken into consideration."

May Own 100 Acres The decision provides that each Jewish colonist in Biro-Bidjan, in addition to working on collective farms, is to be allowed:

- (1) To obtain land as personal property and for personal use, limited to an area of one hectare (the equivalent of 100 acres). The land which he obtains as private property will be in his possession for perpetual use, for which he will be given a State document.
- (2) The produce of this private land will belong to him personally and not to the collective.
- (3) In addition to the land, each colonist is also permitted to have in his personal possession two or three cows and calves, two to three sows and their litter, twenty to twenty-five sheep and goats, an unlimited number of poultry, and up to twenty beehives.

Must Work on Collectives While owning private property, the Jewish colonists will also have to work on collective farms. The decision does not specify whether the land given to Jewish collective farmers for private use will have to be bought by the individual colonist. The land will be granted by the State from its vast territory in the district.

The Jewish autonomous region of Biro-Bidjan takes second place in the whole of the Far East for this Spring's sowing campaign, it was announced today in connection with the new decision. "The Spring sowing in Biro-Bidjan has just been completed," according to the announcement. The plan for what sowing has been carried out 100 per cent by the Jewish colonists.

Find London Has 145 Synagogues

Located in 29 Boroughs That
Had None in 1904,
Survey Reveals
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, June 20.—There are 145 synagogues out of a total of 4,722 houses of worship of all denominations in the Greater London area, according to an expert survey by Arthur Black, published here in the British Weekly.
Synagogues are now to be found in twenty-nine boroughs or districts that had none in 1904 when a similar survey of church facilities was undertaken. At that time, within the area of London was not so large, there were sixty-three synagogues in the London area. Today, in the same area, there are

142. Between 1904 and the present, while the number of churches in the area surveyed in 1904 increased only slightly, from 4,926 to 4,207, the number of synagogues more than doubled.

The growth in number of the synagogues is ascribed by the survey to the fact that the Jewish population which, thirty years ago was almost completely concentrated in the East-End, is spreading out. Jews are establishing businesses in favorable neighborhoods and moving into better houses and districts as fortune favors them, it is pointed out.

Several new synagogues are now under construction in outlying sections of London which a few years ago had few Jewish residents.

Harvard Cites Einstein, Mann

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., June 20—Prof. Albert Einstein and Thomas Mann, both exiles of Nazi Germany, were honored today by Harvard University which bestowed honorary degrees upon them and ten others, including Henry A. Wallace,

Secretary of Agriculture. In presenting Prof. Einstein with the degree of Doctor of Science, Dr. James E. Canant, president of Harvard, read the following citation:

"Acclaimed by the world as a

great revolutionist of theoretical physics, his bold speculations, now become basic doctrine, will be remembered when mankind's present troubles long are forgotten."

Dr. Mann, non-Jewish self-exile from Germany, was made a Doctor of Letters as "one of the few contemporary guarantians of the great tradition of German culture."

The honoring of Einstein and

Mann, both of whom went into exile after the advent of Hitler, lends new emphasis to Harvard's rejection last year of a scholarship offered by Ernest F. S. Hanfstaengl, prominent Nazi, Harvard graduate and Hitler aide. The scholarship was rejected on the ground that it could not be accepted from a man so closely associated with a regime striking at the traditions of education and democracy.
