MEPHON OF U.S. PLAN AS BASIS FOR TRUSTEESHIP TALKS BARS CHANGE IN PALESTINE MANDATE

SAN FRANCISCO, May 17. (JTA) -- Adoption of the American plan on trusteesip as a basis for discussion, by unanimous vote of the UNCIO's Trusteeship Comlike, means that there will be no change at present in the status of Palestine, acwells to well informed observers here.

The U. S. plan provides for the transfer of mandated territories to trusteehip woluntary agreement between the mandatory power and the Security Council of the sweld organization. The agreement will specify the terms under which the terrimy will be administered. Since only general machinery is being set up here, such generats will be the subject of future negotiations.

The American plan meets the demands of the American Jewish Conference and the American Jewish Committee that nothing shall be done here which would impeir a rights of Jews in connection with Palestine. It authorizes the Trusteeship Cunil to receive petitions and institute periodic investigations and states that the worse of the trusteeship system is to insure the economic and scoial advancement the propes concerned and also develop self-government in the trusteed areas.

At a press conference here yesterday, representatives of the New Zionist immission urged that the Palestine mandate be placed under some international materity for five years, after which Palestine should become a Jewish state. AND FRANKFURTER, WHO KILLED SWISS NAZI LEADER, PARDONED; SERVED NIME YEARS

BERN, May 17. (JTA) — David Frankfurter, Yugoslav Jewish medical student to assassimated Wilhelm Gustloff, Swiss Nazi leader, in 1936, has been pardoned after wring half of his eighteen-year term, the Swiss radio announced today. During his three-months' stay in Falestine, Rabbi Heller is expected to study every phase of the development and upuilding program which is being supported by American Jews through the UPA.

In a statement issued in connection with Shevuoth, which will be observed tware and Schurday, Rabbi Ecller revealed that more than 1,700 rabbis will appeal for aid to Palestine during Shevuoth services in their synagogues, and will urge support of mass Jewish settlement there.

SANTIAGO, Chile, May 17. (JTA) — Julio Barrenschez, vice-president of the Chilean Parliament, told a memorial meeting for Jewish war victims, last night, that the San Francisco conference should coopt an international bill of rights as part payment of the debt the world owes the Jews.
