DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1934—APPLICATION TO PREPARATIONS OF EXTRACTS OR TINCTURES OF INDIAN HEMP.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA { *Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor to wit. of the State of South Australia.*

(L.S.) C. M. BARCLAY-HARVEY.

BY virtue of the provisions of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1934, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the abovementioned Act shall apply to any preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance containing any preparation of any extract or tincture of Indian hemp, except any such preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance intended only for external use, in

the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 4 thereof.
