Cancer is the second leading cause of death in the District of Columbia (2011-2020).



DC Cancer diagnosis rates are higher for men compared to women (456.8 versus 405.6 per 100,000).



DC Cancer deaths are higher for men compared to women (185.7 versus 146.3 per 100,000).



African Americans had a higher incidence rate compared to Whites (468.7 versus 356.9 per 100,000).




African Americans had a higher mortality rate compared to Whites (204.9 versus 102.4 per 100,000).
