> LETTER DECISION ON MOTION TO STRIKE AND MOTION TO DISMISS

RE: HF No. 129, 2020/21- Miguel Angel Puentes Rosabal v. Terex and Broadspire Greetings:

The Department of Labor & Regulation (Department) received this Motion to Strike and Motion to Dismiss submitted by Terex and Broadspire (Employer and Insurer) on July 16, 2021. Miguel Angel Puentes Rosabal (Claimant) was given until August 25, 2021 to respond, but he did not do so.

The record shows that Claimant filed this Petition for Hearing (Second Petition) with the Department on June 8, 2021. He had filed a previous Petition, hearing file number 46, 2016/17 currently pending before the Department, also alleging he suffered a work-related injury to his teeth and to his left arm during his employment with Terex. The first Petition was submitted in July 2016. After Claimant's attorney was allowed to withdraw on September 7, 2018, Employer and Insurer's counsel has had no contact with Claimant.

Employer and Insurer have moved to strike Claimant's Second Petition under

SDCL 15-6-12(f) which provides,

Upon motion made by a party before responding to a pleading or, if no responsive pleading is permitted by these rules, upon motion made by a party within twenty days after the service of the pleading upon him or upon the court's own initiative at any time, the court may order stricken from any pleading any insufficient defense or any redundant, immaterial,

impertinent, or scandalous matter.

Petition submitted June 8, 2021 is properly dismissed and struck. If Claimant wishes to

It is hereby ORDERED that Employer and Insurer's Motion to Strike and Motion to Dismiss is GRANTED. Hearing file 129, 2020/21 is STRUCK and DISMISSED.
