The Office of the Deputy Mayor for Education has compiled a resource guide to help schools navigate available resources and supports to enhance safety and wellness for their campuses, including information on how to request services from the Department of Behavioral Health, weekly calls for Safe Passage Priority Areas, and details on communication channels with public safety agencies and available resources.
