Pain in pediatric patients is common, under-recognized and undertreated. Unrelieved acute, chronic, and needle pain in childhood directly results in poorer clinical outcomes, including increased morbidity, degree of anxiety, needle-phobia, health care avoidance, and chronic pain and may contribute to substance use disorders. *Focused on pediatrics, this online course addresses pain management, opioid state medical board CME requirements and the new federal DEA requirements [Medication Access and Training Expansion (MATE) Act] for education in the treatment of opioid and substance use disorders.*

## Welcome to Recovery-Friendly Care for Families Affected by Opioid Use Disorder

### Why Is This Topic Important?

There is much at stake when parents with opioid use disorder (OUD) welcome a new baby into their home. Parents are often strongly motivated to begin and maintain opiate recovery to provide a safe, stable, and nurturing environment for their child(ren). For infants, successful parental support can lead to early upstream prevention of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs).

Primary care pediatricians and other pediatric health providers\* can encounter challenges in initiating successful and sustainable practices for coordinating care for postpartum people with OUD, and infants diagnosed with neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome (NOWS). This course aims to support community-based pediatric health providers and their teams in implementing recovery-friendly approaches and environments within the patient- and family-centered medical home framework.

\*For this content, the term **pediatric health providers** encompasses pediatricians (pediatrician, pediatric medical subspecialist, and pediatric surgical specialist), nurse practitioners, physician assistants, family medicine physicians, and trainees.

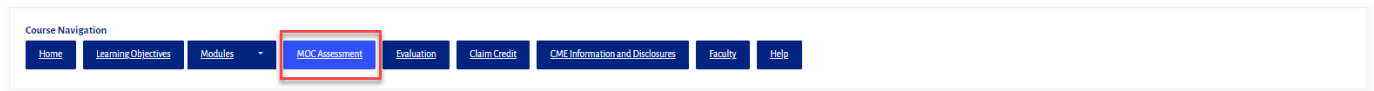

# Claiming MOC

## MOC Part 2 Information/Assessment


Diplomates of the American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) may earn up to 6 ABP MOC Part 2 points for participating in *Managing Acute and Chronic Pain and Substance Use Disorders in Pediatrics* and successfully completing a reflective self-assessment. Follow the instructions below for completing your assessment and claiming your points.



### Assessment Requirements:

1. Participate in the *Managing Acute and Chronic Pain and Substance Use Disorders in Pediatrics* enduring activity; only those that are verified registrants are eligible for points.
2. Select **4 distinct sessions** that had the highest value to your practice. These sessions must be designated for CME credit.
3. Complete the MOC Self-Assessment by **Tuesday, October 31, 2023, at 4:00 pm CDT**.
  - You will be asked, "How will the new knowledge and/or skills you gained in this session change your practice and impact the care of your patients?" in 75 words. Be specific and detailed.
  - **No late assessments will be accepted.**

4. Within 30 days of the review of your reflective self-assessment, if complete, the AAP will upload your points through the Accreditation Council for CME (ACCME) Program and Activity Reporting System (PARS).

Once all the MOC requirements have been completed, navigate to the **Activities and Credit Management** page in the **My Account** section of AAP.org. Once there, you'll see a list of activities that are eligible to claim. To claim the MOC credit, locate the activity and click the **Submit MOC Credit** button.
