2021 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Awards – Non-Competitive

- DOEE Project Scoping for FloodSmart Homes Retrofit totaling \$244,053 in federal share, \$76,266.66 local
- DOEE Project Scoping for DC Kenilworth Park/Watts Branch Environmental Study totaling \$300,000 in federal share, \$500,000 local
- DDOT Project Scoping for Living Shoreline in Buzzard Point neighborhood in SW totaling \$242,987 in federal share, \$132,013 local
- DPR Project Scoping For Recreation Center Resilience Hubs totaling \$212,960 in federal share, \$66,550 local

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Highlights

- BRIC supports projects that reduce risks from disasters and natural hazards.
- In FY 2020, FEMA offered \$1 billion nationwide in hazard mitigation funding.
- Of this, states were allocated up to \$1,000,000 in noncompetitive funding.
 - DC's non-competitive projects are listed to the left.



2021 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Awards - Competitive

 DC Water – Blue Plains Advance Wastewater Treatment Plant (AWTP) Floodwall totaling \$20,319,075 in federal share, \$8,708,175 local

Highlights

 Nineteen states including DC received BRIC Competitive Grant Funds in FY21 versus 10 states in FY20 (90% increase)

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BRIC eligible vs competitive

Eligible

- Minimum criteria and low/moderate scoring
- No low-income pop impact
- Grey infrastructure without green ideas
- Only addresses current conditions
- "Boring" mitigation approaches

- Ideas that improve access to community emergency services through microgrids, flood protection, and other infrastructure protection measures
- Ideas that will help to better understand climate change impacts and the associated hazards
- Ideas that advance the city's equity goals and support the ongoing efforts to promote ReadyDC
- Ideas that can be implement within the next year (FY2023)
