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# 1 DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA NATIONAL GUARD

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*Mission:* Joint Force Headquarters-District of Columbia (JFHQ-DC) maintains and provides trained and ready D.C. National Guard (DCNG) units, personnel, and equipment to achieve the federal war-fighting mission, to support the District of Columbia Emergency Response Plan, and to add value to the community through local programs. JFHQ-DC facilitates the integration of federal and state activities to provide expertise and situational awareness to the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense.

*Services:* Federal mission is to support the readiness of DCNG units to perform the federally assigned mission, both at home and abroad. District of Columbia personnel provides direct support to key functional areas including operations, training, and readiness to ensure DCNG units can defend the nation and the Capital. The District Mission (Emergency Preparedness and Response) is to prepare for and respond to requests for National Guard support from the Mayor, lead federal agencies within the National Capital Region, and Joint Force Headquarters - National Capital Region (JFHQ-NCR). The community mission is to maximize the use of available Department of Defense family and youth programs to support the citizens of the District of Columbia.
