- Mobile-first use
- Growing mobile device use

1. Birkodi, Kumta, Karnataka

A tiny fishing village by the Arabian Sea in north Karnataka.

About 15 dwellings, a mosque, a primary school, and a run-down provisions shop.

-- as of November 2014

Latifa Bi (fisherwoman), *“We catch fish and sell it in the town. We don’t make more than five thousand rupees a month...”*

One of her sons discusses fish prices on WhatsApp with other fishermen, *“The middlemen cannot fleece us now.”*

He only uses WhatsApp, Facebook and Nokia Maps. (Nimbuzz before the emergence of WhatsApp.)

2. Sangli, Maharashtra

Chanda lives in Gokul Nagar, one of its red-light areas of Sangli.

- Crank callers are an occupational hazard
- Hooked on: Sex work and Mobile Phones

"Silicon Valley of India"

Differentiated from classified websites such as OLX and Quikr.

- Apps of e-commerce websites + Advertising by way of campaigns (E.g.:Big Billion Day Sale by Flipkart); The urban poor now access e-commerce.
