
DISPLACEMENT CRISIS
687 170 forcibly displaced people in Niger of which²:
335 277 IDPs in total
269 922 total refugees³

FOOD INSECURITY
 Currently **2.3 million** people in food crisis (phase 3-5) and **3.2 projected** in **June-August 2024** on a population of 25 million people

DEMOGRAPHIC CRISIS
3.7% population growth rate (the highest in the world)

MIGRATION CRISIS
18 000 migrants expelled from Algeria to Niger in 2023 increasing trend compared to 2022)

ACCESS
 Limited humanitarian access, imposition of armed escorts and refusal of humanitarian actors in particular in **Tillabéri**

EDUCATION
941 primary schools closed due to conflict out of **17 997** countrywide
