- Innovation and technology driven efficiency

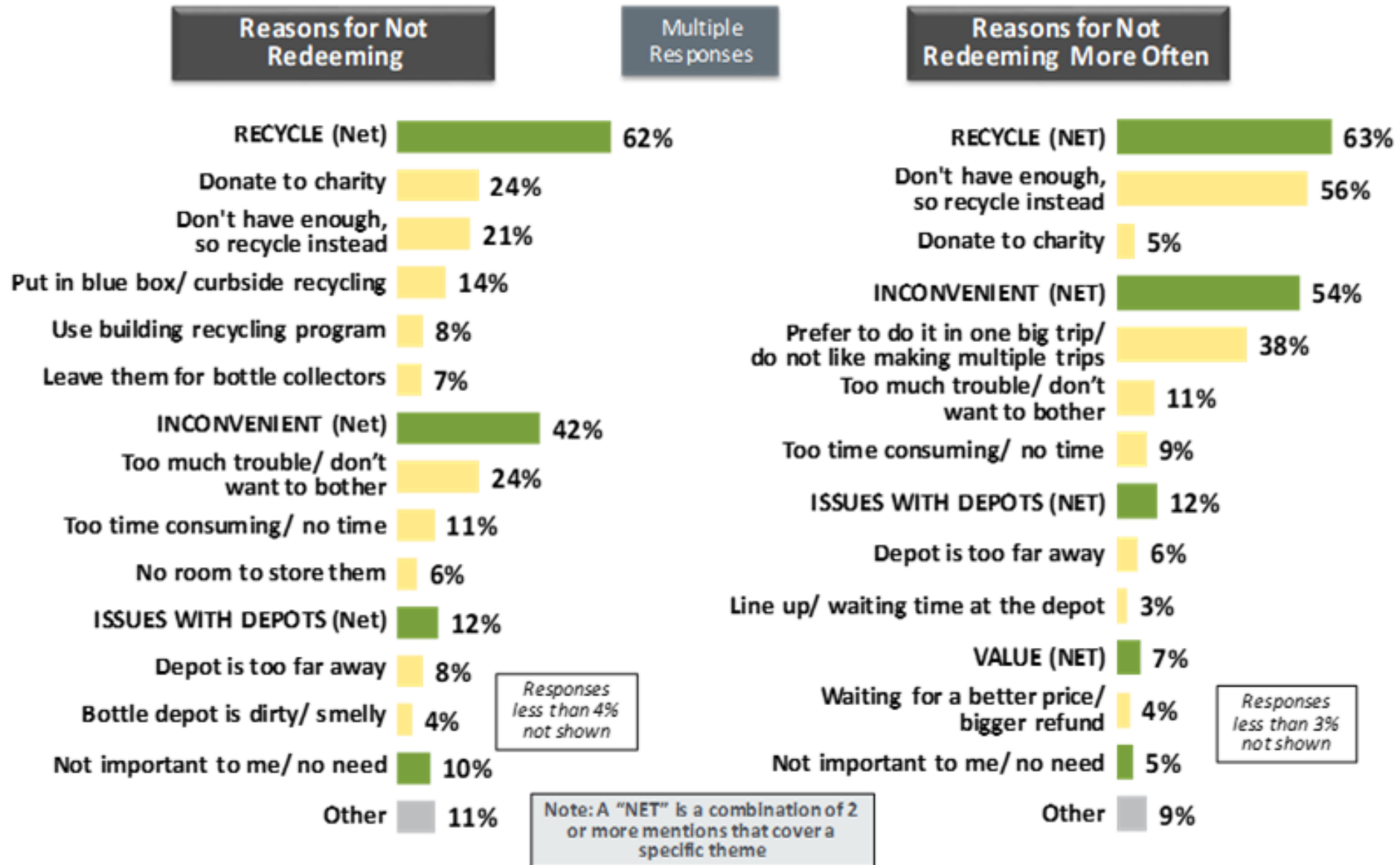
BCMB Service Standards

- We want to reward those who are excelling

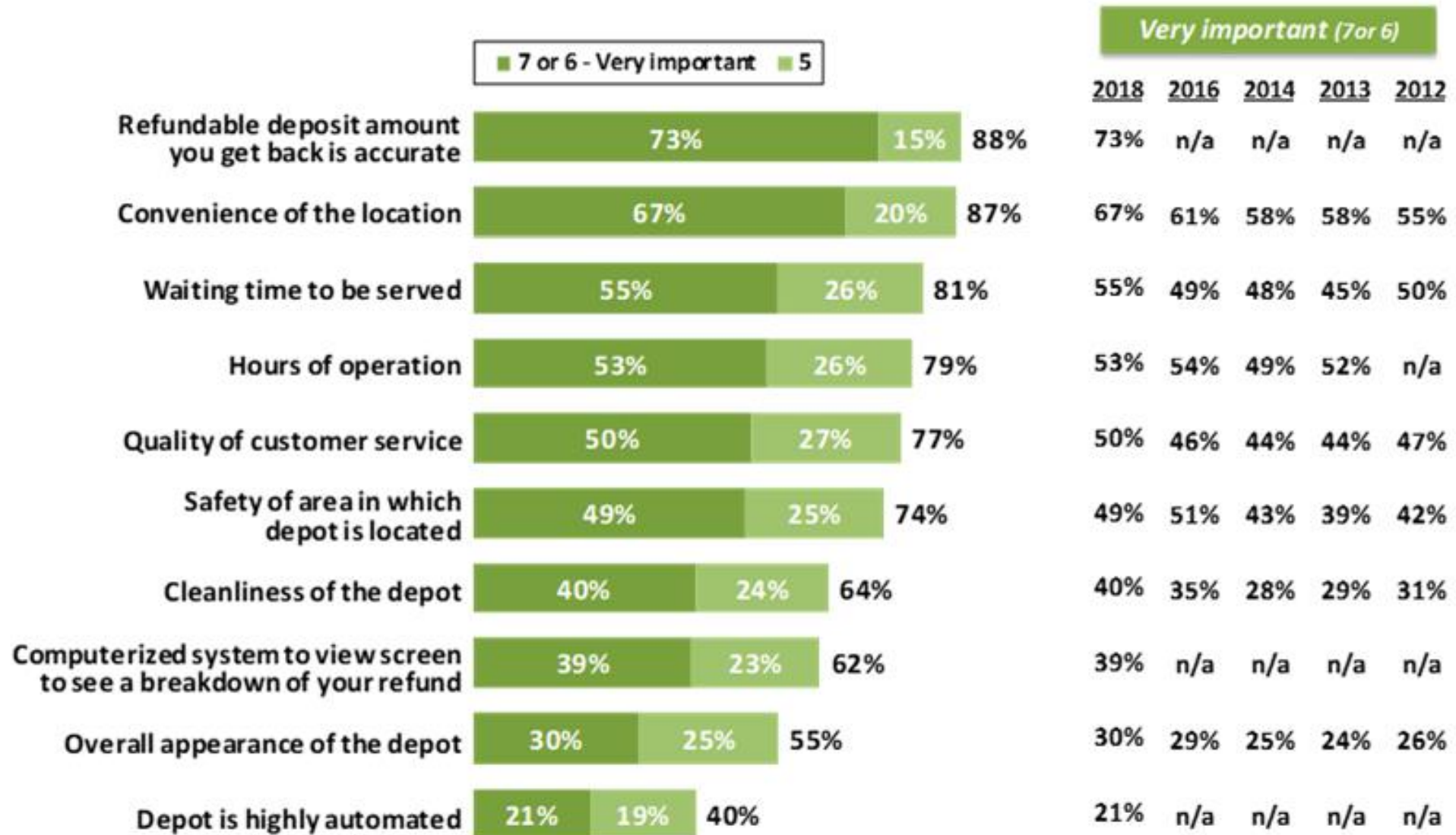

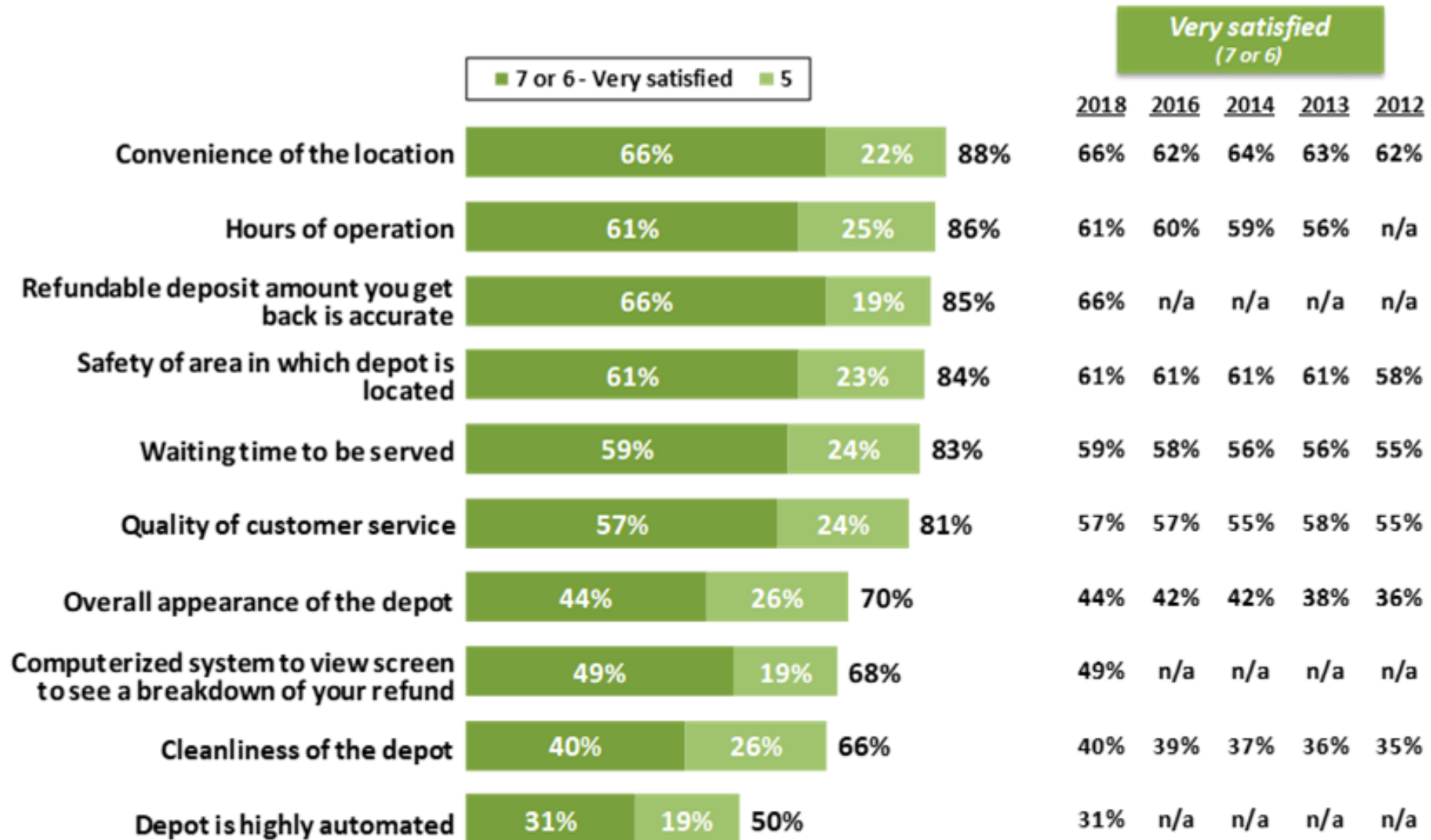
Why don't you return containers to a depot, or why not more often?



How important are these factors when deciding which depot to go to?



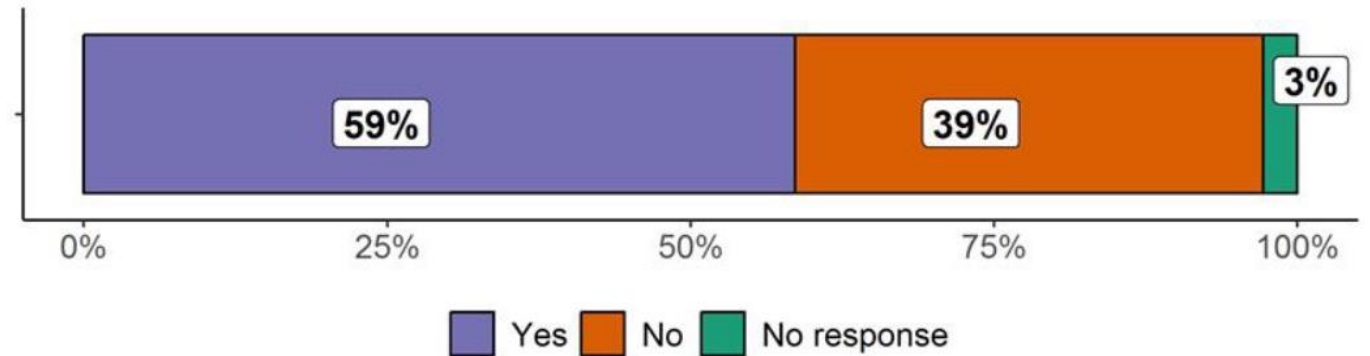
How satisfied are you with these aspects of the bottle depot?



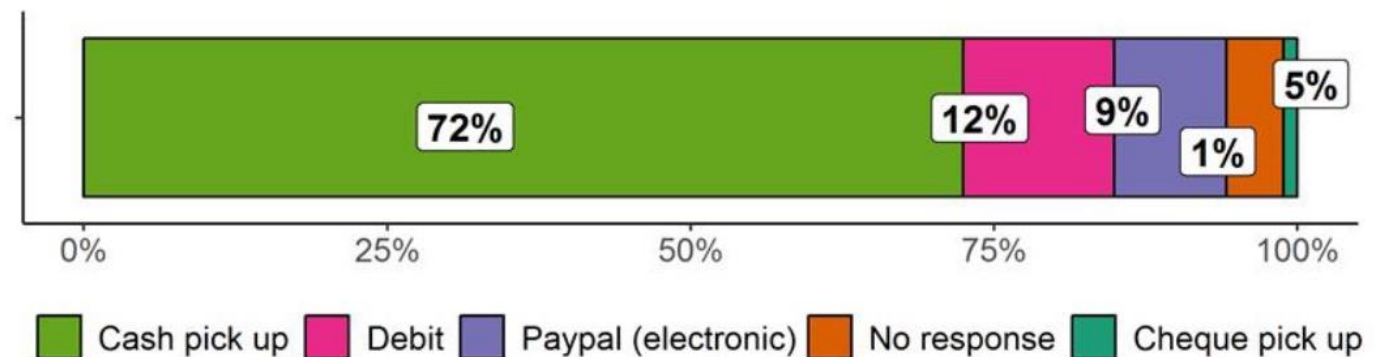
Quick Drop

Q13B. If yes, what would your preferred form of payment be?



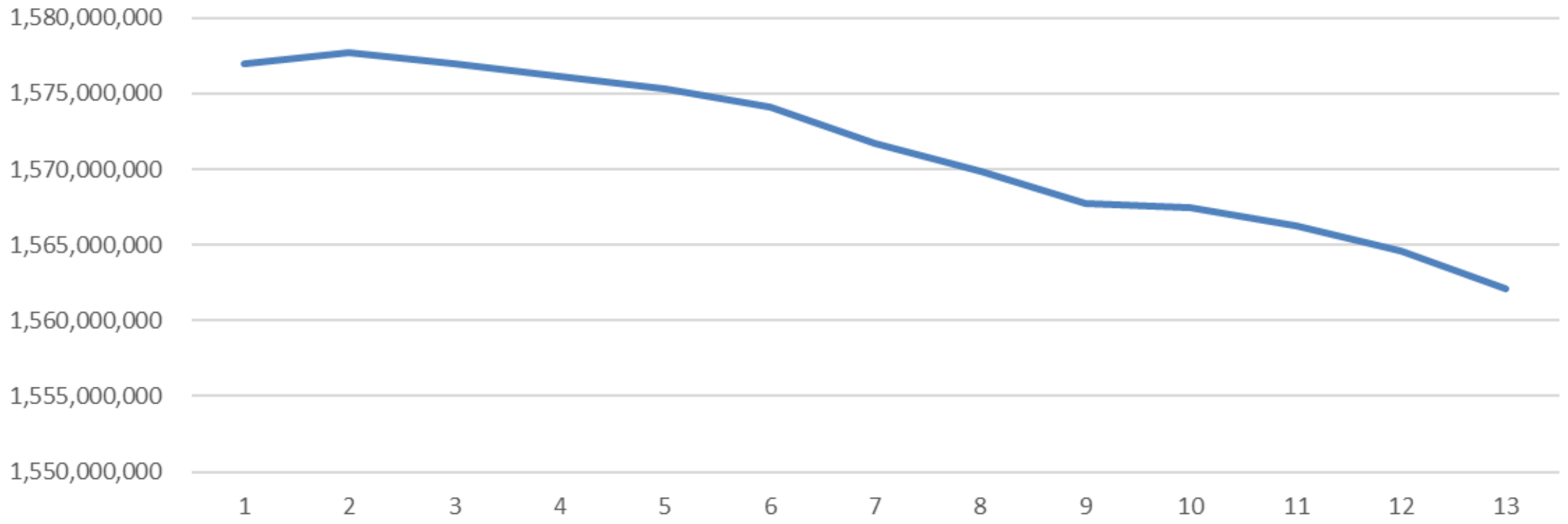

IPSOS REID 2018: Reported incidence of redemption is significantly lower in Calgary (83%) compared to Smaller Cities South (95%, also higher than 86% in Edmonton), the Rural South (92%), the Rural North (94%), and Smaller Cities North (91%).

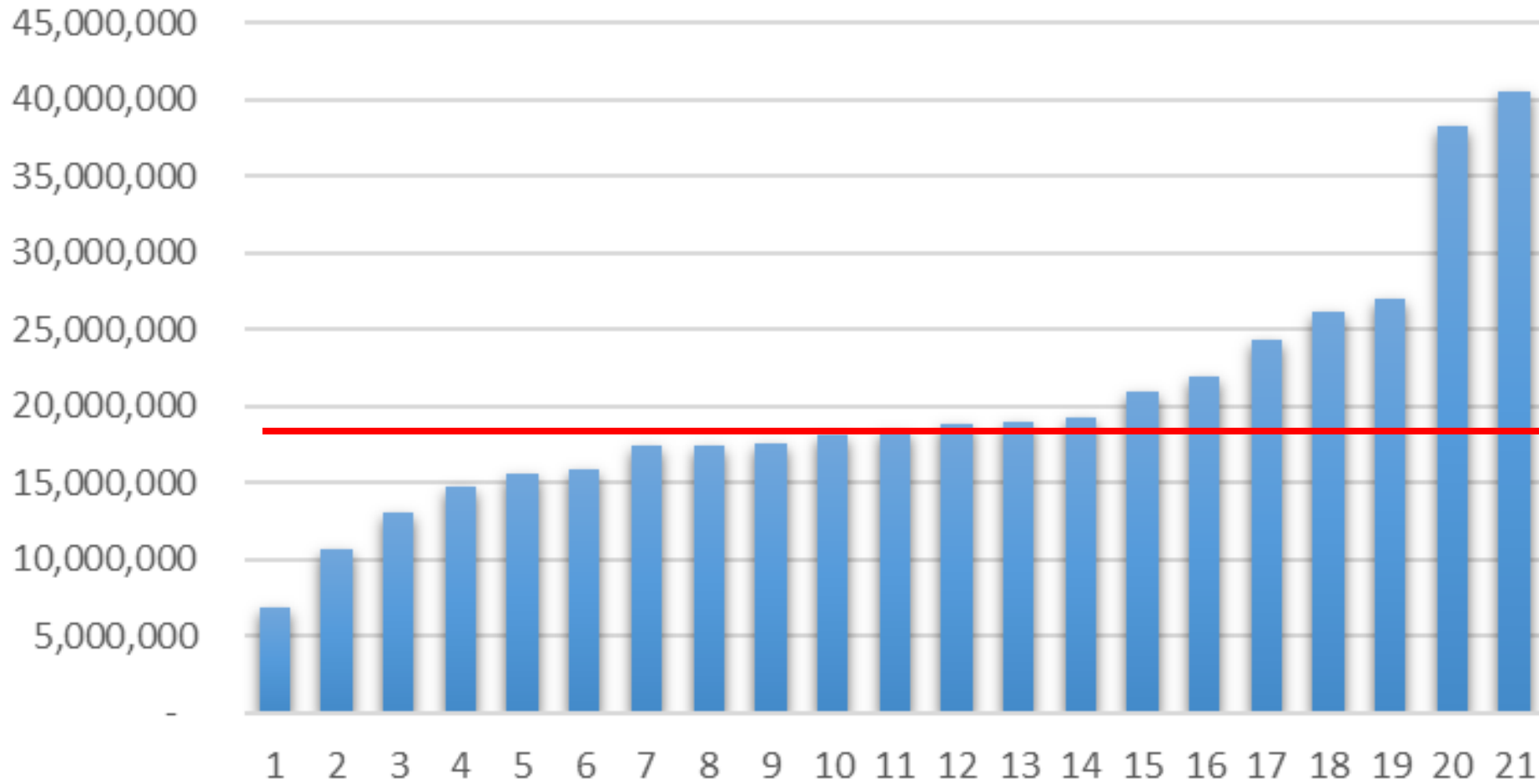
Depot By-law

Unless otherwise directed by the Board:

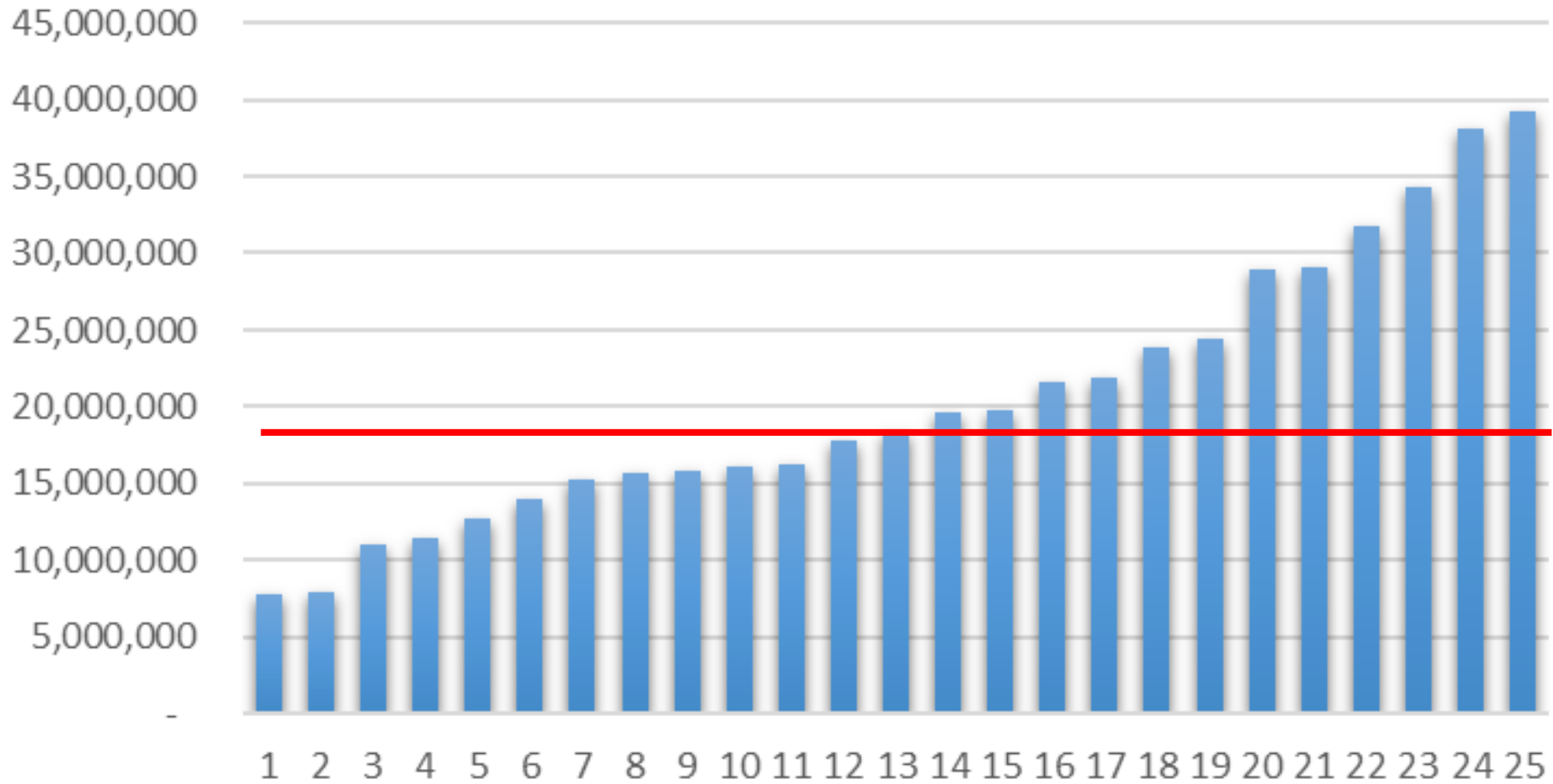
- “the number of Depots allowed in a Metro Area shall be calculated by dividing the population of that Metro Area by 40,000.
- “no new Permit may be issued in a Metro or Urban Area for a Depot that will be located within a 3-kilometre radius of an existing and operating Depot.

“The decision whether or not to issue an RFA is in the sole discretion of the BCMB
