

DEBORAH MOLLISON

A prolific composer of concert music, film scores and songs, Deborah Mollison has gained international recognition for her talent. Mollison's great diversity of style is born of a love for the adventure of writing music and is facilitated by her scholarly achievement empolying an acute sense of perfect pitch to express empathically felt emotion and meaning. This ability to empathize not only makes writing to picture a 'natural' process for Mollison but is also reflected in her concert music. Mollison's Violin Concerto 'Ocean Witness' grew out of concern for the plight of whales and dolphins. A Horn Concerto, 'Global Nation', commissioned by the Britten Sinfonia is placed in a world of interwoven cultures, challenging racism amidst the green and blissful inspiration of 'forever England'. Mollison's most ambitious and recently completed work, a tone poem entitled 'May's Words' was inspired by the writings of Maya Angelou; personifying the composer's role in society as a musical commentator, Mollison also finds time to score for film, most recently 'Simon Magus', to be released in 1999. Television commissions, of which the present recording of music for BBC's 'Earth Story' series is a fine example, shows an adaptive and resourceful Mollison combining her innate skills of orchestration with that of the midi studio programmer/musician.

The Earth is a living. moving planet, almost organic in the way it is constantly evolving. The simplicity and strength of the different processes which shape the Earth. when combined, create a sophistication of form. The idea of strong melodic lines giving form to the whole series was one that seemed appropriate for the music of Earth Story.

The music finds as its source an organic string bed, on top of a myriad of differing instrumentations and moods which spring to life. In some instances a subject is associated with a particular musical theme, which is maintained wherever possible throughout the series. For example, there is a selection of themes used for the 3D graphic sequences of the evolving globe.

Working alongside programme makers absorbed in knowledge, outstanding photography and incredible revelations, was both thrilling and inspiring.


