

Dr Grace Warren

The honorary degree of Doctor of Medicine was conferred upon Dr Grace Warren by the Chancellor Sir Hermann Black at a special conferring of degrees ceremony held at 6.00pm on Thursday 2 May 1985 which celebrated the centenary of the first graduations by women at the University of Sydney.

The other four women awarded honorary degrees at the ceremony were Miss Helen Elizabeth (Betty) Archdale, Dr Margaret Mulvey, Ms Edna Ryan and Justice Elizabeth Evatt.
