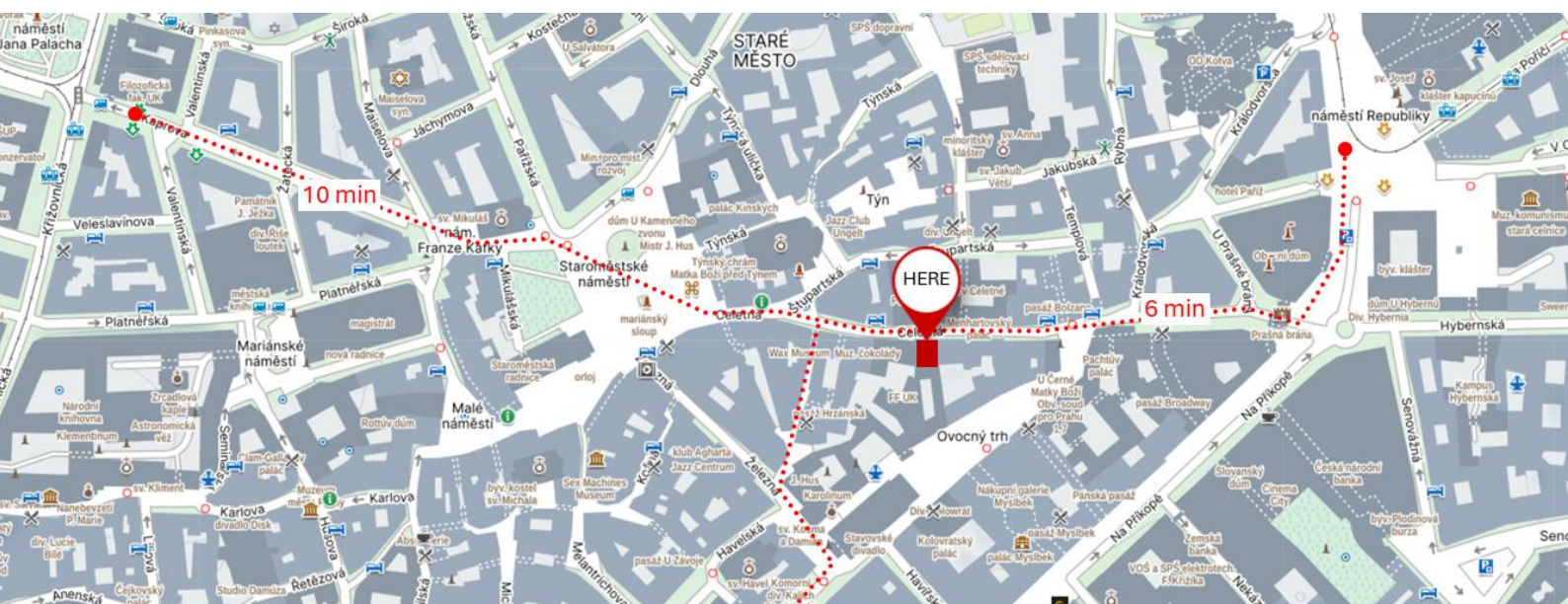

## Public Transport

Prague has a reasonable public transport network, consisting of 3 underground metro lines, trams, buses, part of the railroad network, a trolleybus, a funicular and couple of ferries.

**Timetables** differ on Saturday and Sundays from the weekdays. Apart from online resources, timetables can be found printed at each stop. Typically, the transport runs often enough during the day that no ahead planning is needed. Night trams and buses are running at night from around 0:00 to 4:30, however, they have different numbering and routes. Metro does not run at night.

**Tickets** are time based and stay valid when switching between lines as well as transport modes. This includes ferries and part of the railroad network, however, the funicular requires at least 24 hours ticket (alternatively, separate ticket can be purchased on site).

The most convenient way to **purchase** tickets is through the official mobile app. For short term tickets listed above, no account is required.

Alternatively, tickets can be purchased at contactless terminals in all trams, buses and metro stations. Paper tickets are also available from points of sale as well as vending machines, mostly available in metro stations (also at the airport).

There are no barriers or checkpoints entering or exiting public transport vehicles. If you have a paper ticket, you need to validate it in a validator either inside tram/bus as soon as entered, or before entering a metro station. If you purchase tickets through the app, note that the purchase and activation steps are separate. You may be asked to produce a valid ticket at any point during the transport.

**Long-term** tickets are available (30/90/365 days) at points of sale, but either need a separate card made in your name, or are less financially attractive (anonymous ones starting at 1000 CZK/€40 for 30 days).

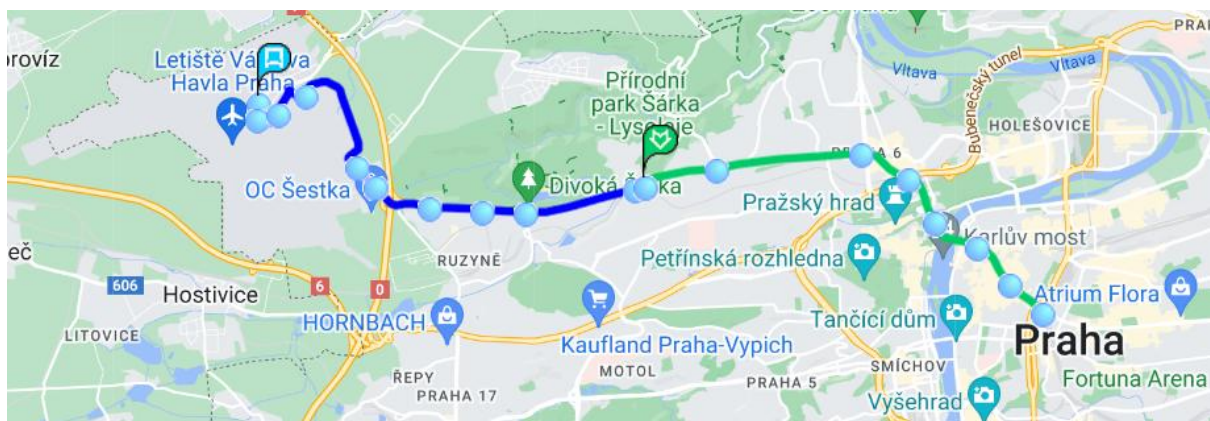


## Airport Transport

The international airport of Václav Havel (PRG) is located in the north-west of the city (Ruzyně). **Uber Airport** is the official taxi service of the airport and their taxi can be requested without any app either at self-service kiosks or at a service counter located in the arrival area.

It is, however, possible to use **public transport** to commute between the airport and the city centre. This trip is around 30 minutes, involves at least one change and it is covered by standard short-term tickets priced as above.



- From airport, take bus 119 to Nádraží Veleslavín, where you can switch to metro line A (green). Metro stops in the old city centre are Staroměstská, Muzeum, Můstek for line A, and Náměstí Míru and Můstek for line B (yellow).
- To airport, take metro line A (green) to Nádraží Veleslavín, where you can switch to bus 119. Get off either at Terminál 1 (for flights outside of Schengen area) or Terminál 2 (for flights within Schengen area).

*Note: Bus 119 is planned to be replaced by a brand-new trolleybus line 59 in spring.*

## Parking

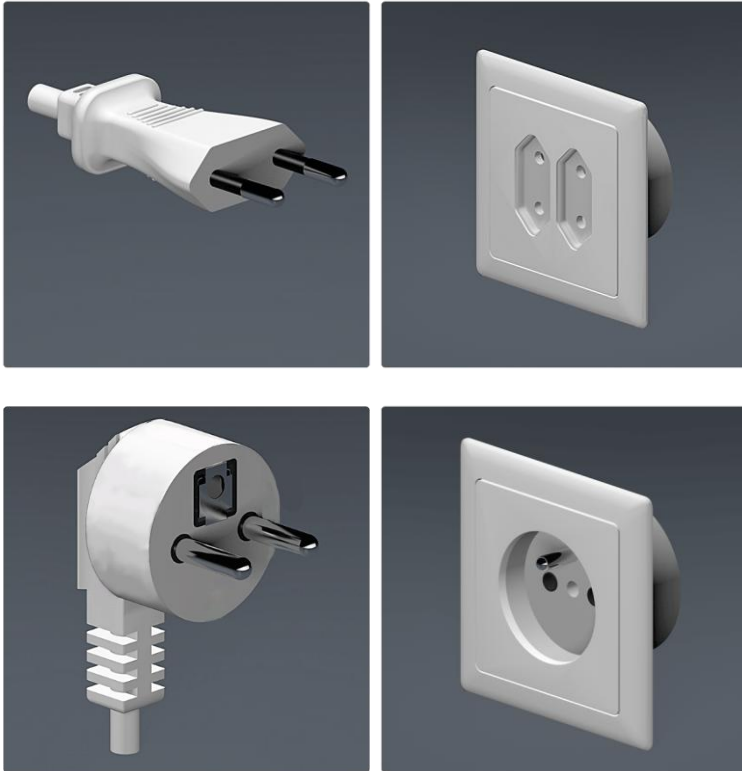

Since the meeting venue is in the centre of old town which includes pedestrian zones, there is **very limited** options for public parking. It is recommended that cars are parked at one of the [Park & Ride](#) places and the trip to the city centre is done via public transport. Otherwise, Prague employs parking zones. Blue zones are for local residents only and unavailable to general public. You would be allowed to park in purple zones for a fee, should you find a space. Parking zones can be seen e.g. on this [map](#) (as blue/purple lines).

## Electricity

Standard electricity supply in Czech Republic is 230 Volts at 50 Hertz. The IEC plug types are C and E.



## Telecommunications

The international dialing prefix in Czech Republic is +420. Prepaid SIM cards without any subscription are available.

Internet access may be available in libraries, coffee shops, malls, certain shops and at hotels.

## Language

The official language of Czech Republic is Czech, a language of the Slavic family.

Most younger people should be able to communicate in English. The city centre is a busy tourist area and as such businesses are generally able to communicate in English as well. Note, however, that according to 2016 data, 74 % of the general population above 40 years of age cannot speak English.

# Credit and Debit Cards

Visa and MasterCard credit and debit cards should be widely accepted. American Express cards are NOT widely accepted, except for some hotel chains. Please contact your card provider prior to travel to ensure that your card can be used in Czech Republic.

## Taxes

Most goods and services are subject to Value Added Tax (VAT), which has the base rate of 21 %. Prices displayed in shops and restaurants already have VAT included.

Citizens of countries outside of the European Economic Area travelling by air are eligible for VAT refund for goods over 2000 Kč (around €80) when leaving the country.<sup>1</sup> However, special receipts need to be requested from the seller, one stating VAT REFUND and one COPY.

## Tipping

Tipping in sit-down restaurants is appreciated, usually to round up the value for easy change if paying cash.

2023 data from card payments indicate:

- Average tips were 6.12 %
- In around 21 % cases, customers weren't leaving any tips
- In around 37 % cases, tips were around 5 %
- In around 33 % cases, tips were around 10 %
